CAVANAGH, Michelle: Margaret Holmes The Life and Times of an Australian Peace Campaigner

This is the untold story of an Australian peace legend. Spirited and strong-willed, Margaret Holmes was shaped by some of the twentieth century's most defining moments in war and peace.

Born into a wealthy, professional family, in leafy Wahroonga, Margaret discovered pacifism at Sydney University, married a doctor and had six children. She was already being watched by ASIO when, in 1960, she formed the NSW branch of the Women's International League for Peace and Freedom.

Speaking out against Australia's involvement in the Vietnam War, apartheid in South Africa and chemical and biological weapons, Margaret was made a Member of the Order of Australia in 2001.

This book is a celebration of what one woman can achieve in her lifetime.
